


A Note from the Choir Director **Special Music for Summer**

(The above comments a paraphrased from Jim Lo's *Connect with God* pamphlet.)



Note From Trustees

During the May 8 All Church meeting the SCUMC trustees reported on several tasks that have recently been completed.

Trustees noted that some of the inside beams of the steeple were in poor condition due primarily to weather related rot. George Wemmer contacted a friend, Greg Varehegyi, and they worked together to make the repair. They were able to secure the beams with steel braces. The steeple is now safe and secure. However, we will need to continue to check the on-going condition of the steeple.

Thank you letters were sent to Greg and Victor of Ohio Engineering and Manufacturing since any costs and materials were donated by them.

Trustee Randy Raw has been working with Dan Plucinski, a local electrician, who the church has previously employed to complete several electrical improvements, ex. front porch lights, pole lamp near church front steps, parking lot, etc., at a price of \$1400.

The parsonage has a new tenant as of May. The previous renter moved to a new location in April. Richard Frost, trustee, and the Administrative Board worked with Wadsworth Real Estate to select our new renter. The new renter was vetted by Wadsworth Realty who determined that he had a good credit standing and income. We secured a fourteen month contract at \$1800 per month. This gentleman also foresees no problems with the energy company regarding the use of the parsonage driveway for their work.

Trustee future tasks being contemplated are adding gravel to the parking lot and investigating the cost to pave a portion of the parking lot. Due to the age and condition we are also investigating the cost of replacing the heating and air-conditioning of the church building sometime in the future.

We will continue to report on these and other tasks throughout the summer.
