Dear Sharon Center Family,

I don't have to know it all – because He does.

Isaiah 26:3 says, "You will keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on You, because he trusts in You." Keeping your mind stayed on Jesus isn't easy, but it is worth it. May this Autumn remind you that change is always coming, but we have a big God who gives us all we need and never leaves us as we whether the change.

Get Insight


