Dear Community of Faith:

Prayer is important to Jesus and to the followers of Jesus. There are over 650 different prayers recorded in the Bible, and prayer is mentioned over 600 times depending on what translation of the Bible you are reading. Jesus commanded his disciples to "watch and pray". I Thessalonians 5:17 is one of the shortest verses in the Bible, and the NIV says: "Pray continually." The Passion Translation says, "Make your life a prayer." I like the idea of my life being a prayer, that everything I say or do would be in an attitude of an awareness of Christ beside me, Christ within me, Christ before me, Christ behind me. Lord, how can I get to a place where my life is a prayer?

I think the first step is to start. I don't think it means that we go about our day chanting prayers and throwing ashes on our head, but I can increase my awareness of his presence throughout me day. I could have a place of prayer in my home, a special chair or a special place on my mantel where I bring my requests to the Lord. Daniel used to pray three times a day, morning, mid-day and evening. Do you pray before you go to bed? When you get up? Before you eat?

We are blessed with a prayer Labyrinth in our own backyard. The Labyrinth doesn't require that you do anything other than walk and be silent, and perhaps have an open heart to hear God speak. I encourage you to walk the Labyrinth by yourself or come to one of our monthly community walks. Perhaps a walk on the Labyrinth could be your first step to increasing the time you spend in prayer.

I encourage you to consider getting a COVID19 vaccine. A website that might be helpful is www.vaccinefinder.org. It is my hope that as more people get vaccinated, we will be able to meet more freely. We continue to wear masks, keep 6' between one another, sanitize our hands and stay home if we don't feel well, and offer our Worship on YouTube.

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (Romans 15:13)


Did Someone Hand You This Newsletter?
