From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

Time seems to pass by so quickly! I used to laugh when my Mom used to say that to me when I was a teenager. And now, decades later, I finally understand what she meant. As Summer turns to Autumn and the signs begin to appear, we are breathless at the speed of change. I looked out my kitchen window this morning to discover a half dozen or so bright red leaves on the tree in our yard. October is a favorite month, filled with color, cool breezes, harvest moons and hay rides.

The Scriptures tells us to pay attention to the signs all around us so that we are not surprised by the coming of the new. As much as we long to hold on to the things that are passing away, God brings about new and amazing things that are even better. But sometimes we hold on too long to the past, and miss out on what is happening right now in front of our eyes.

I have learned so many things from the dementia patients that I visit. When you struggle with memory loss, you can't remember the past, and you can't think too much about the future. You only focus on the present — what's happening right now — and that is all. The present becomes much clearer; I am more thankful for what I have right now; and I notice it's beauty and appreciate it's wonder. I think that's what God wants us to do too. God wants us to notice the present moment and not look too longingly into the past or to anticipate the future. I have learned to be content with what I have right now.

For the month of October we will be focusing on Second Timothy and a call to not be ashamed of our faith. Each Sunday we will claim the faith we've been given with boldness and not meekness; we will present our faith clearly, without distractions; and we will present out faith with everything we've got, so that when we are asked, we can confess with a clear conscious that we held nothing back.

We still need volunteers for the Fall Foliage Tour on October 8 and 9<sup>th</sup>, or join us for Bible Study, to pass out treats or assemble Christmas Boxes. We've always got something cookin'!



# Did Someone Hand You This Newsletter?



# Fall Foliage Tour

Medina County Fall Foliage Tour: A Medina County tradition since 1968

Since 1968, the drive-it-yourself Medina County Fall Foliage Tour has educated the participating general public about agriculture, education, and history of Medina County. Each year, the tour highlights 10-15 places of interest that can include farms, agribusinesses, historical societies, and special events – among others. The tour is not intended to be a commercial, political, or retail event and, through the years, has been able to maintain its agricultural and educational integrity while growing into the major fall event in Medina County.

The Medina County Fall Foliage Tour is being held October 8 and 9<sup>th</sup> from 12 to 5 each day. It is organized by the Fall Foliage Tour Committee and funded through participation fees and community sponsorship. Agencies represented on the organizing committee are: Medina County Park District, Medina County Soil and Water Conservation District, Medina County Convention and Visitors Bureau, Medina County District Library, Medina County Farm Bureau, and OSU Extension-Medina County.

Sharon Center United Methodist will be a 'stop' on this tour, highlighting our historic heritage with a display of quilts. If you have a quilt that we can display for those two days in our beautiful sanctuary, please contact Nikki in the office or Pastor Jane. We also need people to sign up to greet our visitors. Sign up sheets will be available in the back of the church or contact Nikki or Pastor Jane. Let's show Medina County some Methodist hospitality!




