From the Pastor

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When someone asked Dallas Willard, an American philosopher, theologian and professor of spiritual formation, what books we should read to be better disciples of Jesus Christ, Dallas listed Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. That's it. This proved to be a little disappointing, thinking that discipleship must require a degree in theology, or reading thick books about lofty ideas, or some other hard tasks. Dallas recommended that disciples of Jesus spend twenty <u>years</u> reading and memorizing Jesus' words found in the gospels, available to everybody, making them a part of every part of our thinking, talking and walking. Dallas recommended that we memorize as much of the gospels as our brain would absorb. For Dallas, that was discipleship.

I'll admit that I stray away from the Gospels sometimes, and I am currently reading "Seeking God: Finding Another Kind of Life with St. Ignatius and Dallas Willard" by Trevor Hudson. It's not really a book about discipleship, but it does give guidance on how to develop a closer relationship with the Lord. Trevor gives three possible to responses to the invitation to be a disciple:

Accumulate more and more information about Jesus. Seek out inspirational experiences or spiritual, feel good "highs". Interact with Jesus daily or moment-by-moment.

I have been a passionate seeker of both 1 and 2 above, and I'm working on #3. Seminary, Bible Studies, personal study, are all good and necessary. My faith is certainly stronger because of them. I am often inspired by music or Worship. But it's a daily walk with Jesus that makes all the difference in my life.

I encourage you to think about your discipleship journey. Are you closer to Jesus today than you used to be? Perhaps re-directing your thoughts more often is the key to transforming your mind and life into something more like Christ.






# Cookie Sale

Sharon Center Community Trick or Treat Night



What Is AmazonSmile?

AmazonSmile offers all of the same items, prices, and benefits of its sister website, Amazon.com, but with one distinct difference. When users shop on AmazonSmile, the retailer's Foundation contributes 0.5% of eligible purchases to the charity of your choice.
